

BRITISH RED CROSS COMMISSION - RELIEF SECTION 109 - IVSP

Fortnightly report to 6th March '46

DEPARTURE

During the above period the Section received a movement order and moved from Bremke to WESTBEVERN, north of Telgte and about 12 km from Münster. Our attachment is now to HQ MIL. GOV., R/B MÜNSTER

The parting from the friends we had made in the village, in Göttingen, and in Friedland Camp made it an even more unpleasant operation than usual.

The work remaining to be done by a B. R. C. Section has been handed over to Canteen Sec. 2 (Salvation Army).

Three of our Unit, Messrs Bramham, Pitkeathly and Miss Girling have remained behind at Friedland where they are the nucleus of a 'Work Scheme' which is made up of sixteen persons -- the balance of thirteen being mostly students from Göttingen University who come for varying periods. Owing to the movement of the Unit and our not yet being on the telephone we have not received the latest reports but before we left everything pointed to the success of the experiment both from the point of view of work produced and the value of the discussion and other leisure activities in the evenings.
