Many thanks for your letters 1 - 5 inclusive, and I am sorry for the delay in answering them, but fortunately our telephone conversation will have done something to bring the position up-to-date.

International Work Scheme.

Thank you for your draft memorandum on this, which in general seems to be just what I wanted. The Executive are considering it today and I will let you have their comments on it, and any suggested amendments, just as soon as I can. I would like you to know how keen the Foreign Service Committee and the National Committee are about possible developments along these lines in Germany, and both encourage you to do all that you can to extend the experiment at Friedland about which we have read Ramsay's reports with great eagerness. I enclose a copy of a letter I have written to Ramsay, and you will notice the comment that John Harvey made, which I think should be carefully borne in mind. Further comment on this question I will leave until I know the Executive's view on your draft.
