Friedland :

(1) The question of Application Forms for Germany should be gone into right away. Ramsay produced the last one without consultation with you because there was no time to do anything else; but we agree that it should be done through you. Ramsay is I think to note several recommendations on this subject and on the organisation generally, if he has time among the details of the new job. Perhaps you can be keeping it in mind, and I'll let you have something in due course.

(2) Badges. There are about a dozen lads who spent a fortnight on the Friedland scheme and proved their worth, and Ramsay recommends that they should be sent badges. He is preparing individual reports on the members of the scheme. I think it would be a good idea to give badges in this way, and if you agree I should like to have say five dozen badges for the present and future.
