Dear Heinz Joss,

I understand from the secretary of the Swiss Branch of the international work-camp movement that you, as a member of that branch have been selected to participate in one of the German international work-camps. These camps are being organised in Germany throughout the year under the aegis of the International Voluntary Service for Peace.

This latter organisation is at present engaged upon relief work in Germany under the Council of British Societies for Relief Abroad, (C.B.S.R.A.), and both this Council together with the Education Branch of the Control Commission for Germany give to these camps their fullest support. They recognise in them not only a practical means of reconstruction, but also, inasmuch as young German men and women work and live there for the good of the community, together with young people from other countries, also a means of re-education and of reconciliation.

You are therefore cordially invited to come to one of our camps for a period between the 1st April and the 1st May 1949. You should apply to the British Military Entry Permit Officer in Bern, who in turn will be notified by the Exit & Entries Branch here that your visit has been sponsored by the Education Branch of the C.C.G.
