

RECOMMENDATIONS FOR THE JOINT PROJECT

DONAUESCHINGEN

1.
Four organizations could have service here at the same time. Three groups of 20 each could work at Donaueschingen and live in separate wooden huts at the refugee transit camp about ten minutes walk from the work site. A fourth group could work and be accommodated at Gutmadingen, about ten kilometres away. There might be possibilities for further groups in three other villages. All necessary transportation, building materials and work tools would be provided by the Genossenschaft.
2.
Cost of maintenance and insurance are assured by the local authorities.
3.
Adequate accommodations is assured.
4.
All groups could maintain their separate identity for discussions etc. more easily than in Evessen or Mülheim, although this would not always be easy with their huts side by side. (The groups would be much closer than envisaged in the original Valley Project).
5.
Opportunities for local contacts with skilled workers and those refugees who would also be working are good in each case, but possibilities for contacts with local inhabitants seem better at Donaueschingen than at Mülheim (but not as good as at Evessen).

MÜLHEIM

One camp of 30 living at Lindenhof and one camp of 15 living at Priesterhof.

EVESSEN

Two organizations could work and live together at work site (maximum number 40).
