I was very glad to learn of the satisfactory discussions between Mr. Krüger of the F.D.J. and Mr. Schenkel, of S.C.I., in early January. I have not, however, received any reply to my letter to you of 21st December, 1963, concerning a formal agreement about the international workcamp to be held this year, and various other points.

As I shall be visiting Austria shortly, I should be very glad if it would be convenient for me to visit you afterwards, so that we can make definite arrangements before the matter is discussed by our International Committee Meeting in March. I should be much obliged, therefore, if you would tell me whether you would be able to see me on the 17th, 18th or 19th of March. If so, could you please confirm this by telegram to reach London on the 4th March at the latest, or by letter to Austria between the 7th and the 14th of March, to the following address:
