4.2 Camps in Western Europe

As already mentioned at the ICM/ESM in Marly 1964, the Austrian group is organising an East-West camp in Linz this summer. Eastern European volunteers will also be invited to normal camps.

4.3 Special arrangements for individual Eastern European applicants for camps in Western Europe (e. g. financial)

Branches were requested to indicate to the ES how much money they can make available to contribute towards travel expenses and pocket money for Eastern European volunteers wanting to participate in Camps in Western Europe.

4.4 Algeria

The ES gave a short account of the present situation of the joint project to be organised with the support of Jeunesse FLN, the Coordination Committee, and BITEJ this summer. As the project will take place in the framework of the Festival of Youth in Algeria, SCI participation in the project will probably be limited.
